Hank served on active duty with the Army (Corps of Engineers) for 10 years, resigning in 1971, with the rank of Major. His first assignment was with the 12th Engineer Battalion in Germany. He then served at Princeton, NJ (Princeton University), Vietnam, West Point (Instructor, Social Sciences Department).

After retirement from the Army, Hank worked as a Budget Analyst for the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) in Washington, D.C. Hank passed away on 11 January 1998, from a brain tumor.

Footnote – Hank, a quiet man of few words, succinctly wrote in his '61 Class Directory biography - "After Germany, Princeton, Viet Nam, the Social Sciences Department and my resignation in 1971, I ended up being in continual contact with the military through my civilian job in OMB.
