How such a little guy could have found so much power has amazed baseball spectators, but those who knew Manny were never amazed at his accomplishments.

Manny served on active duty in the Air Force for 28 years, retiring in 1989, with the rank of Colonel. His career included service with ICBM missiles, B-52 bombers and C-130 gunships. His first assignment was with the 578th Strategic Missile Squadron, headquartered at Dyess AFB, TX. He then served at the Mather AFB, CA (Air Navigation School), McCoy AFB, FL (367th Bomb Squadron, 306th Bomb Wing), Montgomery, AL (Student, Air Command & Staff College, AirC&SC), Auburn, AL (Student, Auburn University), Thailand (16th Special Operations Squadron), Kirkland AFB, NM (Air Force Inspector & Safety Center, AFISC), March AFB, CA (22nd Bomb Wing, Strategic Air Command, SAC), University City, TX (Chief Mission Development Branch), Montgomery, AL (Air War College, AirWC), Shaw AFB, AR (Director of Operations Planning, 15th Air Force), Cambridge, MA (Professor of Aerospace Science, PAS, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, MIT), Eaker AFB, AR (Special Assistant, 42nd Air Division).

After leaving active duty in the Air Force, Manny had a successful career in financial services. He worked for the Reno Housing Authority, a mortgage company, an insurance company, and a financial adviser. Manny passed away on 26 December 2021.
