Bob served on active duty in the Army (Infantry) for 3 years, resigning in 1964, with the rank of 1st Lieutenant. His first assignment was with the 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, NC (Platoon Leader, Company Commander, 503rd and 325th Infantry).

After leaving active duty in the Army, Bob had a successful career in law and politics. He first attended Boston College Law School. He then worked for a Boston trial law firm. He was elected as a Selectman, State Representative and then State Senator. He was not successful in a run for U.S. Congress. He then worked in a private law practice. He was elected Plymouth County MA Register of Probate and Family Court. Bob passed away on 15 January 2022, from vascular dementia.
