Bragg, NC (Judge Advocate Section, Headquarters, 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division), Charlottesville, VA (The Judge Advocate General School Administration, TJAGSA), St. Louis, MO (Headquarters, Army Aviation Systems Command, AVSCOM).

After leaving active duty in the Army, Scooter is believed to have been a Corporate Lawyer and then practiced law as a Partner of the law firm of Evans & Wildermuth Inc. Scooter passed away on 31 July 1980.
