Webb served on active duty with the Army (Armor) for 29 years, retiring in 1990, with the rank of Colonel. His first assignment was with the 35th Armor. He then served with the 3rd Brigade, 81st Infantry (S-3, Air Headquarters), 68th Armor (Tank Company Commander), Ft. Knox (Armor Advanced Course), Vietnam (first tour - Advisor to Cavalry Troop), Atlanta, GA (Georgia Tech University), Vietnam (second tour – G-3, 4th Cavalry, 25th Infantry Division), Ft. Leavenworth, KS (Command and General Staff College), Germany (Aid to SACEUR / USCINCEUR and Executive Officer, 11th Armor), Pentagon (Army Office of the Deputy Chief of Operations, ODCSOPS), Theater Army Replacement Command, TARC, Newport, RI (Navy War College), Pentagon (Office of the Joint Chiefs of Staff for Operations, ODCSOPS), Germany (Commander, 1st Brigade, 1st Armored Division and Chief of Staff, 7th Army Training Command), Ft. Knox, KY (Director, Command and Staff Department, Armor School).

After his retirement, Webb worked for defense contractors in the Washington, D.C. area including the Alion Science and Technology Corporation. Webb passed away on 14 September 2007, from gastro esophageal cancer.
