Jack served on active duty in the Army (Infantry), resigning in 1963, with the rank of 1st Lieutenant. His first assignment was at the 23rd Infantry at Ft. Richardson in Anchorage, Alaska.

After leaving active duty in the Army, Jack work for an engineering firm. He taught 6th graded elementary school in the Los Angeles County, CA and then Carson City, NV for 15 years. He earned a Master's Degree in Education from the University of Nevada Reno (UNR) and was a long time UNR football fan. His last job was his favorite. He served as a Property Appraiser with the Nevada State Department of Taxation where he was responsible for the appraisal of all the state's mining properties. After working there for 13-15 years, he retired in 1997. Jack passed away on 21 May 2015, as a result of a heart attack aggravated by treatment for leukemia in the last few years.

Footnote from Jack – "Our first trip (after leaving the Army) hooked us on the RV lifestyle. We have gone through another travel trailer, a camper, and are now on our second mobile home. We have visited almost all of the national parks and monuments west of the Mississippi, travelled up and down the west coast into Canada and Mexico. I retired in 1997 and Linda in 1998. We have enjoyed our retirement and travel to our favorite places along the CA coast and the Palm Springs area. We also enjoy UNV 'Wolf Pack' football games."
