Jack served on active duty in the Army (Infantry, Aviation) for 24 years, retiring in 1985, with the rank of Colonel. His first assignment was with the 504th, 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, NC. He then served at Fort Rucker, AL (fixed & rotary wing pilot training), Vietnam (1st tour – I Corps Aviation Company), Fort Benning, GA (Company Commander & Leadership Dept. Instructor), Vietnam (2nd tour – 23rd Artillery Group), Germany (Executive Officer, 2/36 Battalion), Fort Leavenworth, KS (Student, CGSC), Blacksburg, VA (Student, Virginia Tech University), Fort Rucker, AL (Aviation Development Test Activity, Branch Chief, Sikorsky Team Chief, Deputy Commander for Test), Fort Belvoir, VA (Student, Defense Systems Management College), St. Louis, MO (Assistant Project Manager for R&D, Blackhawk Program), Fort Rucker, AL (Deputy Commander and Commander for Test, Aviation Development Test Activity).

After leaving active duty in the Army, Jack had a successful career in civilian aviation and business. He was the Manager of St. Louis Operations of the McDonnell Douglas Helicopter Company. Later he started a successful payroll company with his wife, Helen. Jack passed away on 16 February 2023.
