Steve served on active duty in the Army (Artillery and then Ordnance Corps) for 20 years, retiring in 1981 with the rank of Lt. Colonel. His first assignment was with the 16th and 94th Artillery in Germany. He then served at Ft. Sill, OK (Artillery Advanced Course), Vietnam (321st Artillery, 101st Airborne Division), Redstone Arsenal, AL (Army Missile Command, MICOM), Saudi Arabia (Saudi Arabia Modernization), Ft. Leavenworth, KS (Command and General Staff College), Huntsville, AL (Florida Institute of Technology), Huntsville, AL (Ballistic Missile Defense, BMD Technical Center), Ft. Belvoir, VA (Defense Systems Management College, DSMC), Huntsville, AL (Florida Institute of Technology), Huntsville, AL (Patriot Project Office).

After retiring from active duty in the Army, Steve worked for EER, Inc. in Huntsville, AL. In 1990, co-founded and served as Executive Vice President of the Enser Corporation which moved its headquarters to St. Petersburg, FL in 1997. Steve passed away on 29 January 2005.
