Gary served on active duty in the Army (Corps of Engineers) for 27 years, retiring in 1988, with the rank of Colonel. His first assignment was with the 307<sup>th</sup> Engineer Construction Battalion in Fort Bragg, NC. He then served in Thailand (809<sup>th</sup> Engineer Construction Battalion, building the Friendship Highway), Urbana-Champaign, IL (Student, University of Illinois), Vietnam (101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division, RVN), Fort Leavenworth, KS (Command and General Staff College, CGSC), Pentagon, VA (Army Office of the Chief of Legislative Liaison, OCLL), Fort Leonard Wood, MO (Commanding Officer, Training Battalion), Germany (Headquarters, U.S. Army Europe, HqUSAREUR), Carlisle, PA (Student, Army War College, AWC), Okinawa (Deputy Division Engineer, Special Operations Command Pacific, SoPac), Portland, OR (District Engineer, Northwest District covering a large region in the northwest U.S.).

After leaving active duty in the Army, Gary had a successful career in construction management. He worked for EDSI Environmental Consulting (President), Virginia Maintenance Services (Chief Operating Officer), VMS Construction (Vice President & Chief Operating Officer), Parsons Brinckerhoff (Area Manager), Kiewit Construction (Business Development Manager & Project Manager of the light rail construction project in Salt Lake City, UT).
