Bob served on active duty in the Army (Artillery) for 27 years, retiring in 1988, with the rank of Lt. Colonel. His first assignment was with the 1/31st Artillery of the 7th Division Artillery in Korea. He then served at Fort Bragg, NC (82nd Airborne Division and 1/319th Artillery), Germany (Office of the Office of the Commander in Chief, OCinC, United States Army Europe, USAREUR), Vietnam (Headquarters, Field Force Vietnam Artillery, Hq2FFVArty), Fort Campbell, KY (Executive Officer, 8/17 Field Artillery), Doral, FL (Aide de Camp, Commander in Chief, Southern Command, SOUTHCOM), Newport, RI (Naval War College, NavWC), Fort Campbell, KY (S3, Operations, 101st Airborne Division Artillery and Headquarters, 101st Airborne Division), Pentagon, VA (Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Operations, ODCSOPS DA), Mount Pleasant, MI (Central Michigan University), Camp Smith, HI (Office of the Joint Services Staff for Plans, J5, Pacific Command, PACOM), MacDill AFB, Tampa, FL (Headquarters, Readiness Command, REDCOM), Fort Bragg, NC (Office of J3, Operations, Special Operations Command, SOCOM).

After retiring from active duty in the Army, Bob had a successful career in business and volunteer organizations. Bob passed away on 27 January 2021, from ischemic heart disease caused by exposure to Agent Orange in Vietnam.
