Charlie served on active duty in the Army (Armor and then Ordnance Corps) for 27 years, retiring in 1989, with the rank of Colonel. His first assignment was with the 12th Cavalry. He then served with the Headquarters, 81st Ordnance Battalion, Germany (531st Ordnance Company), West Lafayette, IN (Purdue University), Vietnam (27th Maintenance Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division), West Point (Instructor, Physics Department), Germany (Aid to the Commanding General, TASCUM), Ft. Leavenworth (Command and General Staff College), Redstone Arsenal, AL (Headquarters, Missile Command, MICOM), Vietnam (ODATT), Germany (Commander 122nd Maintenance Battalion, 3rd Armor Division), G-4 8th Division, Pentagon (ODCSL), Chambersburg, PA (Commander, Letterkenny Army Depot), Ft. Belvoir (Project Manager, Mobile Electric Power). Before retirement he served as the Deputy Commander of the Army Office of the Deputy Commander for Research Development and Acquisition.

After retirement from active duty in the Army, Charlie served as a private sector consultant with several government contractors in the Washington, D.C. area. This included serving as a Project Manager for Logistics Technologies, Senior Logistics Manager for ITS, Inc., Senior Manager for Computer Sciences Corporation (CSC) and Program Manager for Bunyard Enterprises. Charlie passed away on 18 June 2009, from Lewy body Dementia.
