Minnesota, was a semi-hive, and did a great deal

**Died** – 10 May 1967 (age 30), killed-in-action (KIA) in Vietnam. Buried at Fort Snelling National Cemetery, Minneapolis, MN.

Military Awards – Bronze Star, Purple Heart.

Dick served on active duty in the Army (Corps of Engineers) for 5 years, until his untimely death in 1967, with the rank of Captain. His first assignment was with the 91<sup>st</sup> Combat Engineer Battalion. He then served in Korea (7<sup>th</sup> Logistical Command), Ft. Belvoir (Engineer Advanced Course), Ft. Bragg, NC (Headquarters 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division), Vietnam (8<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry Division).

Dick was killed-in-action (KIA) in Vietnam on 10 May 1967, by an enemy sniper.
