



Glynn Clark Mallory, Jr. Co K-1

Glynn came to West Point from the farm; a true Southern Gentleman, athlete and scholar. After absorbing the initial shock of Beast, Glynn continued to do his best in everything he took part. His capacity for work, his glowing friendship, and his moral fiber will make him well remembered by the men of Kappa Uno.

Born – 10 Feb. 1939 at Natchez, Mississippi.

To USMA – From Waterproof, LA. Appointed by Congressman Otto Passman, 5th District of LA. Nickname – “Mal”.

Died – 20 Feb. 2020 (age 81) at San Antonio, TX. Buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

Military Awards – Silver Star Medal, 5 Bronze Star Medals (one with V), Purple Heart, 2 Army Commendation Medals, 2 Legion of Merit Medals, 3 Army Distinguished Service Medals, Combat Infantryman Badge.

Schooling – MBA Degree, University of Georgia, Command and General Staff College, CGSC, Army War College, AWC.

Family - Wife – Linda (Holstein) Mallory (55 years) – 3 children (Margaret, Glynn III, Amber) – 6 grandchildren.

Glynn served on active duty in the Army (Infantry) for 34 years, retiring in 1995, with the rank of Lieutenant General. His first assignment was with the 187th Airborne Infantry Regiment (AIR). He then served at Fort Campbell, KY (101st Airborne Division, Aide de Camp, AdC to the Assistant Division Commander, ADC, and then 3/7th Cavalry), Vietnam (1st Tour – Company Commander, 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne Division, RVN), Fort Benning, GA (Infantry Advanced Course, TIS), Athens, GA (University of Georgia), Vietnam (2nd Tour – S-3, Operations Officer, 2nd Brigade, 4th Division, RVN), Fort Leavenworth, KS (Command and General Staff College, CGSC), West Point, NY (Tactical Department), Fort Carson, CO (Commanding Officer, 4th Division, 8th Infantry Regiment), Carlisle, PA (Army War College), Pentagon (Office of the Secretary of the Army, OSA), Wiesbaden, Germany (Commanding Officer, 4th heavy armor Brigade, 4th Infantry Division and Assistant Division Commander, 8th Infantry Regiment), Pentagon, VA (Director of Operations, Military Command Center, Joint Chiefs of Staff, JCS), Fort Eustis, VA (Deputy Chief of Staff Training, DCST, Training and Doctrine Command, TRADOC), Fort Hood, TX (Commanding General, 2nd Armored Division), Pentagon, VA (Director of Operations, Readiness and Mobilization, ODCOPS, Headquarters, Department of the Army, during Operations Desert Shield / Desert Storm), Presidio, CA (Commanding General, 6th Army).

After retiring from active duty in the Army, Glynn was active in a number of church and community activities as a volunteer. He spent many hours helping wounded warriors at the Brooke Army Medical Center. Glynn passed away on 20 February 2020 from acute myeloid leukemia due to myelodysplastic syndrome (MDS).

Footnote from Glynn – “Looking back over the years to reflect on my memories of West Point, there are two things that stand out. First, I enjoyed playing 150 pound football. Second, and most important, we had an uncommonly good group of Classmates in Company K-1. We grew close as Cadets, and those friendships have endured and grown over the years.”
