Gary was blown East from the wind swept plains of Nebraska with the rest of the corn. Famous for his frequent Glee Club trips, sobriety, receding hairline, and desire for pilot's wings, Webley made what promise to be many lifelong friends and has developed an attitude which will carry him far.

Gary served on active duty in the Air Force for 5 years, resigning in 1966, with the rank of Captain. His first assignment was at pilot training school at Enid, OK. He served as a C-124 (Globemaster II) cargo plane pilot with the 1707 Air Force Transport Wing, TTU at the Hunter AFB in Savannah, GA, and then the 541st Cargo Squadron, CSq. He flew missions world-wide including carrying troops, equipment and supplies to South Vietnam during the Vietnam War.

After leaving active duty in the Air Force, Gary had a successful career as a financial planner. He continued to serve for a period of time in the Air Force Reserve. He obtained a Master of Science, MSIM Degree in Information Management from Georgia Tech University in Atlanta. He worked for IBM in marketing, then a computer consulting firm, and a financial planning firm. He became a Chartered Financial Analyst, CFA. Gary passed away on 7 July 2021, from cancer.
