This tall, dark haired Texan is best known for his bright smile and character interpretations of certain members of the faculty. Even though sometimes at odds with the academic departments, he managed to separate his time between extracurricular activities and one sweet heaven of the "pad." Born – 25 Dec 1939, Texas.

Died – 9 Sep 2011 (age 71) at Gainesville, FL. Buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

Military Awards – 2 Bronze Star Medals, 2 Legions of Merit, Air Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Combat Infantryman’s Badge.

Schooling – Master’s Degree in Psychology, Georgia Tech University, Armed Forces Staff College.

Family – 2nd wife – Cindy Groosen Peters (26 years), 1st wife – Rosalind Field Peters – 1 step-daughter (Paige) from the 1st marriage – 1 grandchild.

Glenn served on active duty in the Army (Infantry) for 23 years, retiring in 1984, with the rank of Lt. Colonel. His first assignment was with the 20th Infantry Division in the Panama Canal Zone. He then served at Ft. Bragg (508th Airborne Infantry and Company Commander, 7th Special Forces Group), Vietnam (first tour - Company Commander and Battalion S-3, 5th Special Forces Group), Ft. Knox, KY (Armor Advanced Course and Company Commander, Army Training Support Center), Vietnam (second tour – G-3, Headquarters 1st Infantry Division and Executive Officer, 28th Infantry Division), Atlanta, GA (Georgia Tech University), Ft. Bragg (Headquarters, Army Combat Development Command, CDC, Special Operations Agency and Headquarters, Army Information Management Agency, IMA), Norfolk, VA (Armed Forces Staff College), Germany (Executive Officer, 28th Infantry Division and Headquarters, U.S. Army Europe, USAREUR), Pentagon (Office of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, J-3), Ft. Myer, VA (Deputy Commander, Military District of Washington).

After retiring from active duty in the Army, Glenn worked as the Vice President for Space and Defense Systems with CEXEC, Inc. and then as a part-time consultant with CEXEC until 2009. Glenn passed away on 9 September 2011, from biliary tract carcinoma.
