Larry served on active duty in the Army (Corps of Engineers) for 9 years, resigning in 1970, with the rank of Major. His first assignment was in South Korea with the 11th Combat Engineer Battalion (Platoon Leader and Battalion Adjutant). He then served at Columbus, OH (Student, Master's Degree in Civil Engineering with a minor in Photogrammetry, Ohio State University), Fort Belvoir, VA (Engineer Advanced Course), Pentagon, VA (Southeast Asia Liaison Officer, Office of the Chief of Engineers, OCE,), Savannah, GA (Deputy District Engineer, DDE, Federal Contracting Officer and Chair of the Claims Committee), Vietnam (Deputy Chief of Design, Headquarters, U.S. Army Vietnam, USARV, Long Binh).

After leaving active duty in the Army, Larry had a successful career as a Consulting Engineer in water and waste water engineering. His specialties were the design and construction of treatment plants, pump stations and pipelines for municipalities. Employers included Malcolm Pirnie, Inc., Turner Collie & Braden, Inc., Brown & Root, USA (Senior Engineer Manager), Rust Lichliter / Jameson (Department Manager), RPS Klotz Associates (Division Manager), Skala Consulting (Director and Owner). Larry passed away on 28 April 2017, from complications from Alzheimer's disease.
